Working primarily in sculptural ceramics, Linda is also interested in breaking the boundaries of the ceramic "vessel", challenging conventions and traditional audience perceptions of this art form.

Through employing scale and repetition, abandoning plinths, and including other materials in her work, Linda creates a sculptural landscape environment where the audience become a part of the artwork.

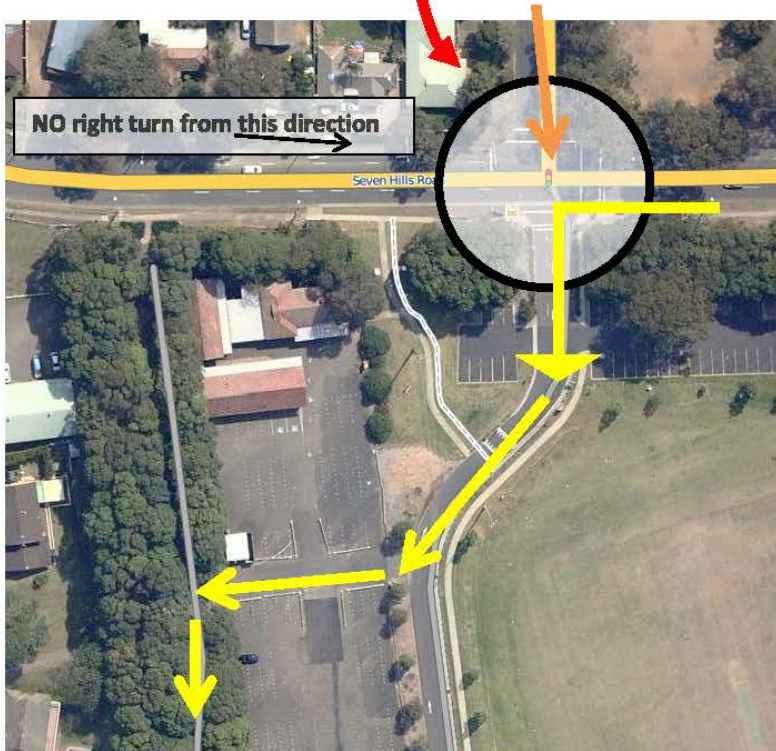
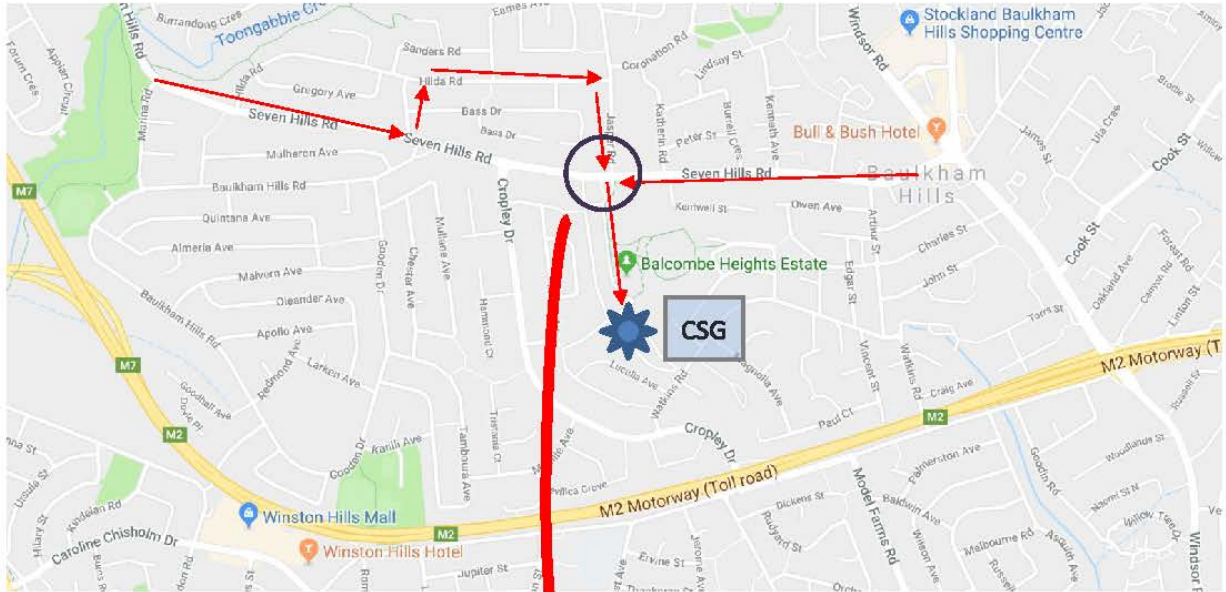
