Alexander de Vos

Alexander's interest in medieval pottery started in 1991 when he joined the Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA), an international living history group which covers a time span of 1000 years of European history from 600-1600AD. Since then, he has concentrated on reproducing medieval pottery forms to cater for the SCA and other living history groups. As the salt glazing method used in German stoneware has not changed significantly since it was first developed in the late 14th Century it became a key focus of his work.

In 2006 Alex set up a studio space in Murrumbateman, New South Wales, where he continues to research medieval pottery. Recently his work has focussed on cookware and the earthenware pottery of the Netherlands and England. The use of these vessels provides a range of insights into their form and function that cannot be obtained elsewhere.

Plenty of free parking.

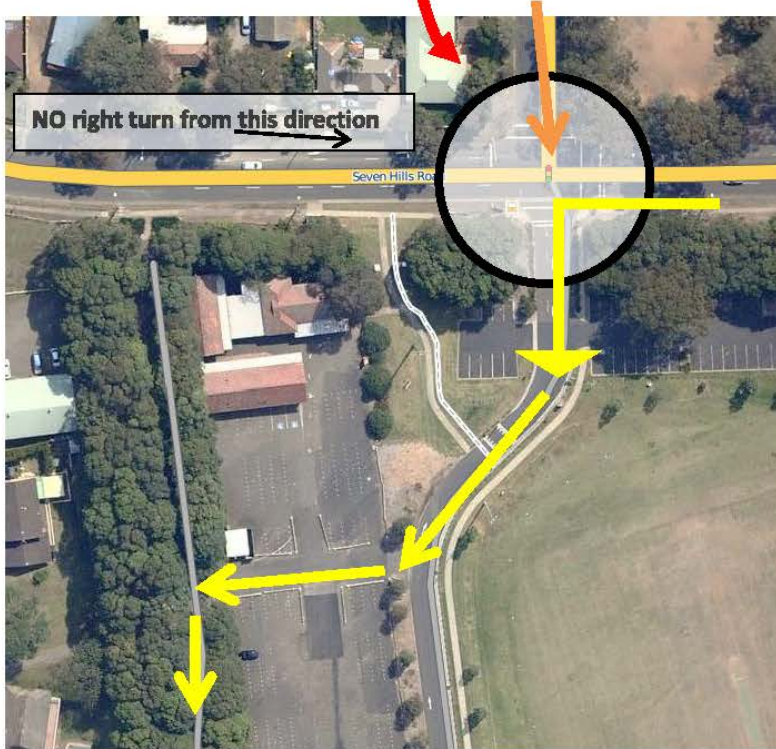
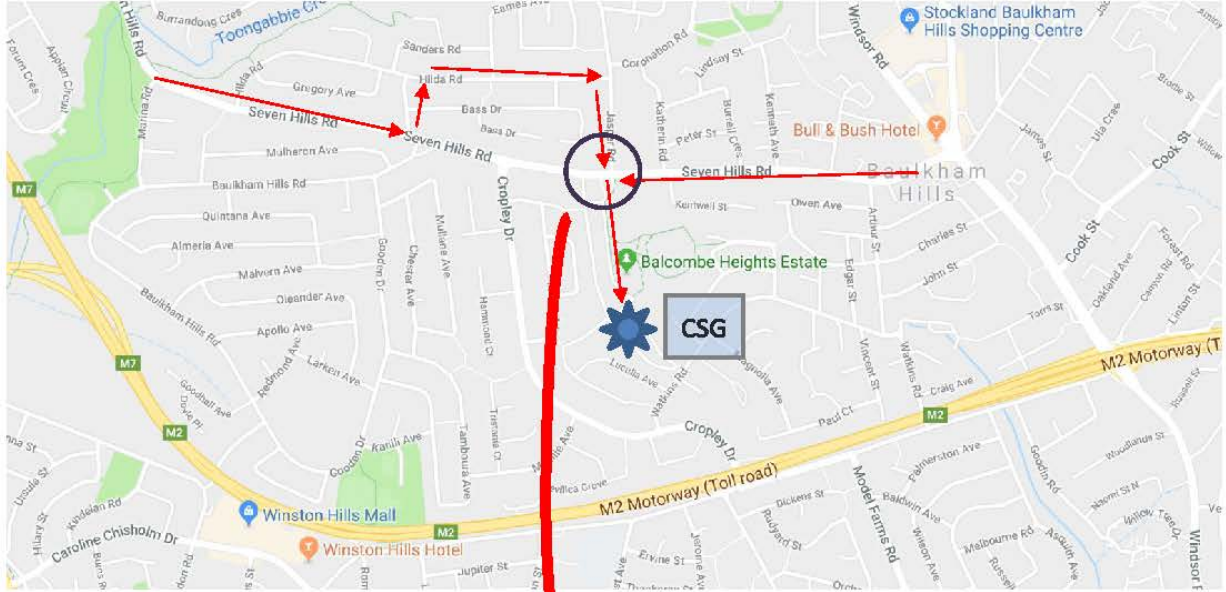
